SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURERS

Eyes: Immediately flush eyes with water while lifting the upper and lower lids. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

SECTION 7 HANDLING and STORAGE

Precautions for Safe Handling: Avoid contact with the eyes, skin and clothing. Wear protective clothing and equipment as described in Section 8. Use with adequate ventilation. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Keep containers closed when not in use.

Conditions for Safe Storage, Including any Incompatibilities: Store in a dry, well-ventilated area. Protect from physical damage. Store in original container; keep tightly closed. SECTION 11 TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Eye: Contact may cause irritation with redness and tearing.

Skin: Prolonged skin contact may cause irritation and drying of the skin.

Inhalation: Inhalation of vapors may cause mucous membrane and respiratory irritation Ingestion: Ingestion may cause gastrointestinal irritation, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

Sensitization: This product is not expected to cause sensitization.

Chronic Effects: Repeated inhalation of large amounts of silica dust over an extended period of time may result in a progressive, disabling disease, silicosis. However, the crystalline silica in this product is bound in the liquid polymer matrix and dust exposure would not be expected.

Carcinogenicity: Titanium dioxide is listed by IARC as "Possibly Carcinogenic to Humans", Group 2B. Respirable crystalline silica is classified as a Group 1 carcinogen by IARC, and "Known to be a Human Carcinogen" by NTP. However, the crystalline silica and titanium dioxide in this product are bound in the polymer matrix and dust exposure would not be expected. Benzophenone is listed by IARC as "Possibly Carcinogenic to Humans", Group 2B. None of the other components present at 0.1% or greater are listed as a carcinogen by NTP, IARC or OSHA.
